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Restorative Solutions are recruiting for a Manager to develop and oversee delivery of the Cautioning and Relationship Abuse (CARA) project across West Yorkshire

Role:	CARA Manager West Yorkshire
Reporting to:	Restorative Solutions' Director of Practice Delivery
Location:	Home based; delivery at sites across West Yorkshire
Salary:	Up to £30,000/annum depending on experience
Hours:	Full time; 37.5 hours/week

Restorative Solutions (RS), working in partnership with the Hampton Trust (HT), have been commissioned by the Police & Crime Commissioner for West Yorkshire to develop and deliver the CARA project across the area for an initial period of 2 years.

You will assist in the recruitment, training and management of CARA sessional facilitators and volunteers. You will oversee the delivery of c 40 CARA cohorts/annum (80 workshops) across West Yorkshire. You will play an integral role as the single point of contact for West Yorkshire Police leads to liaise in respect of process issues, and act as a CARA advocate in developing delivery across the area.

Separate CARA workshops will be delivered for male and female offenders of intimate partner domestic abuse and non-intimate familial abuse who have been referred to CARA by the police as part of a Conditional Caution for their first domestic abuse offence. CARA also places victim /survivor engagement and support at the heart of the intervention.

We are looking for a skilled manager, with experience of working in a multiagency environment and managing multiagency teams, and of working with both perpetrators and survivors of domestic abuse
